1. ANNOUNCEMENT:

Warwick & District Dirt Bike Club, Toowoomba MX Club & Moreton Districts MX hereafter called the PROMOTERS will conduct an Inter-club Motocross Series for Junior and Senior riders at the venues and on the dates as above. The rounds of this series will also be rescored to count towards each Club's "Club Championship Series"

2. JURISDICTION:

- 2.1 The abovementioned meetings have been authorised by MQ who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number's (as above) and are open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia National, Club, Nipper and One Meeting Licences, who are full financial members of one of the Promoting Clubs (no discount or one day memberships are allowed). (OEL to Junior riders that hold a Log Book with and issue date less the 12months)
- 2.2 The meetings will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCR's), these Supplementary Regulations, and any Final Instructions approved by MQ.

BY ENTERING THESE MEETINGS ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.

3. ENTRIES:

- 3.1 Entries open forthwith and can be mailed to the addresses as above for each round, or can be submitted at the venue on the day of the round before the close of Scrutineering. **Entries received by Wednesday 5 days before each round will receive a \$5 discount.** The numbers for each class will be limited, so please enter early to avoid disappointment.
- 3.2 Only entries received on the official Entry Form that are accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
- 3.3 A separate entry form must be used for each round and submitted to the host club of that round.

4. INSURANCE:

- 4.1 National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.
- 4.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.
- 4.3 **IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT WEEKLY BENEFITS INSURANCE.**

5. MEDICAL SERVICES:

Qualified First Aid personnel as per GCRs and MQ by-laws will be in attendance at each race meeting, from the start of practice until fifteen minutes after the last race.

6. ENTRY FEE:

A \$5.00 discount will apply to entries received by mail no later than Wednesday 5 days prior to the round.

6.2 Payment is by cash, cheque or money order and payable to the promoting Club of each round.

7. CLASSES OF COMPETITION AND RACE FORMAT:

1. 50cc Auto Div 1 Demonstration 4/8 yrs inc (all homologated Div 1 plus other suitable machines) 3 x 10 minutes
2. 50cc Auto Div 2 7/8 yrs inc (Inc 6 yr olds that obtained a club/national licence prior 31/12/06) 3 x 10 minutes
3. 65cc 7/9 yrs inc (These classes (3&4) will be limited to forty riders combined and run together) 3 x 10 minutes
4. 65cc 10/12 yrs inc (These classes (3&4) will be limited to forty riders combined and run together) 3 x 10 minutes
5. Mini-Lites 9/11 yrs inc (85cc 2/- & 150cc 4/-{competition model only} SW only) 3 x 10 minutes
6. Mini-Lites 12/15 yrs inc (85cc 2/- & 150cc 4/-{competition model only} SW or BW) 3 x10 minutes

(These two classes (5&6) may be run together if numbers permit it and time requires it. Scored separately)

7. Junior Lites 13/15 yrs inc (100cc BW to 125cc 2/- & 163cc to 250cc 4/-) 3 x 10 minutes
8. Senior Pro, Expert, Intermediate & selected Clubman Lites (up to 125cc 2/- & up to 250cc 4/-) 3 x 10 minutes
9. Senior Clubman Lites (up to 125cc 2/- & up to 250cc 4/-) 3 x 10 minutes
10. Senior Pro, Expert, Intermediate & selected Clubmen Open (127cc to 550cc 2/- & 255cc to 663cc 4/-) 3 x 10 minutes
11. Senior Clubmen Open (127cc to 510cc 2/- & 255cc to 663cc 4/-) 3 x 10 minutes
12. Unlimited Veterans (Over 30 yrs.) (all grades and all capacity machines) 3 x 10 minutes
13. Unlimited Women's Class (all grades and all capacity machines) 3 x 10 minutes

(These two classes (12&13) will be run together and limited to 40 riders combined)

A junior rider's age on January 1 will determine his/her age for competition for the year. However, a rider may move to the next higher class when he/she becomes eligible to do so at any time during the year, but once a rider moves to the higher age class in any competition, he/she may not move back to the lower age class. Points earned in a lower age class will not transfer to the higher age class. This rule will apply to all riders up to and including 16 year olds.

8. AWARDS AND PRIZEMONEY:

All Nipper (50cc Auto Div 1) entrants shall receive an encouragement/participation award of equal value at each round. 50cc Auto Div 2 will receive trophies for 1st, 2nd & 3rd at each round. All other junior classes will receive prizemoney of 1st \$15, 2nd \$10 & 3rd \$5 and all senior classes will receive prizemoney of 1st \$25, 2nd \$20 & 3rd \$15 at each round. There will be overall trophies for 1st, 2nd & 3rd awarded at the end of the series. Points to accumulate during the series. Scoring as per the GCRs. Each Club will contribute \$2.00 / rider from their round towards overall series trophies. Points will also be awarded at each round on an average basis to determine which club is the winner of the "Triple Club Challenge Shield". Conditions are outlined further in the notes.

9. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS:

- 9.1 To constitute a Class, the number of contestants entered and competing in each Class may be six (6).
- 9.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any Class of Competition, the decision to run or cancel the Class, or to combine events will be at the discretion of the promoter/s, subject to the MA Steward's approval.
- 9.3 Entries will be restricted to one full grid (40 riders)per class or combined class. This will be determined by order of receipt of entry. Enter early to make sure you don't miss out and also receive a discount.

10. MACHINES AND RIDERS:

- 10.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCR's for Motocross Competition.
- 10.2 Multiple entry of the one Machine in the same Class of Competition is not permitted.
- 10.3 Change of machine may be permitted if submitted in writing to the Clerk of the Course and with the approval of the MQ Steward at least ten (10) minutes prior to the start of the event in which the substitution is requested. Substitute machine must have passed machine examination, be eligible for the class and replace a machine that cannot be reasonably repaired.

11. RIDING NUMBERS:

- 11.1 Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their Normal Riding Number (The Competition Number on their Licence). All others will be allocated numbers at the Club's discretion.
- 11.2 All Number Plates on all Machines MUST comply with the GCR's.

12. GATE POSITIONS:

Gate positions will be by self-selection.

13. RIDERS BRIEFING:

A Riders Briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing and ALL Competitors MUST attend the Riders Briefing.

14. DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

- 14.1 All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any competition in accordance with Australian Sports Commission policy as implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.
- 14.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors telephone the Drugs in Sport Hotline 1800 020506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prizemoney may be delayed at MQ discretion until the results of the tests are known.

15. CODE OF CONDUCT:

All Competitors, Officials and Parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law - CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the GCRs) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all Motorcycle Race Meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this Meeting and will be enforced.

16. TIMETABLE:

Racing	Starts immediately after the conclusion of practice.

For the purposes of drug & alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 7.00am with the completion of the meeting for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

17. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

All three circuits comply with the MQ Motocross Track Guidelines.

18. STARTS:

All starts will be by forty (40) self-penalising gates.

19. RACING:

There will be ten minutes or five laps of practice whichever is less (as per QMX by-laws) offered per class / per race meeting. Race format will be as per paragraph seven (7).

20. NOISE:

As per the GCR's

21. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

- 21.1 Each Club will re-score each of the three rounds of this series towards their own "Club Championship Series". Each rider will be re-scored only towards the Club Championship Series of the club that they nominate to ride for in the Triple Club Challenge.
- 21.2 The 65cc 7/9 yrs & 10/12 yrs will be run together but scored separately.
- 21.3 A junior rider's age on January 1 will determine his/her age for competition for the year. However, a rider may move to the next higher class when he/she becomes eligible to do so at any time during the year, but once a rider moves to the higher age class in any competition, he/she may not move back to the lower age class. Points earned in a lower age class will not transfer to the higher age class. This rule will apply to all riders up to and including 16 year olds.
- 21.4 No riders will be permitted to compete in Junior and Senior classes or two different age groups (lower and higher), they must choose.
- 21.5 Competitors who under special circumstances are regraded (if applicable), may apply to the Promoter/s to transfer a percentage of their points to their new class. Points can only be transferred to a class of the same capacity.
- 21.6 Riders cannot compete in two different age groups with the same bike at the same meeting. If they choose to stay in a lower age group they are not considered to be eligible for a higher age group. Eg (65cc 10/12 yrs & Junior Lites 13/15 yrs)
- 21.7 Riders cannot compete in Lites and Open classes with the same machine.
- 21.8 Flag Marshalls: The Promoting Club of each round will make the necessary arrangements for Flag Marshalls.
- 21.9 **The Triple Club Challenge Shield** will be determined using the average points scored by a Club at each round. ie the total points scored by each Club divided by the number of riders competing for that Club.
- 21.10 The Club a riders scores points for will be determined by the Club on their MA licence.
- 21.11 If a rider does not have one of the three Clubs on their licence they may choose the Club they ride for. Provided they are a full financial member of that Club.
- 21.12 A rider can choose to change the Club they score points for, by appealing to the promoters (representative/s of each Club). Any appeals **MAY** be determined in favour of the Club the rider has ridden the majority of club days at. Any request to change Club must be made before the first round of the series

CONTRACT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 2007 TRIPLE CLUB CHALLENGE MOTOCROSS SERIES

WARNING! THIS IS AN IMPORTANT DOCUMENT WHICH AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS, PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY AND DO NOT SIGN IT UNLESS YOU ARE SATISFIED YOU UNDERSTAND IT.

1. I THE UNDERSIGNED (see below):

 HEREBY AGREE with Motorcycling Australia Limited ("MA") that I am by this agreement entitled to participate in the motorcycle activity/meeting listed in Schedule 2 (hereinafter called "the Meeting" or the "Event") at the venue listed at Schedule 3 (hereinafter called "the Venue") on the terms and conditions set out in this document.

DEFINITIONS

2. In this declaration:
 - a) "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand, damage, cost or expense however arising including but not limited to negligence but does not include a claim against a Motorcycling Organisation under any right expressly conferred by its constitution or regulation;
 - b) "Indemnitees" means and includes the persons, organisations and bodies corporate whose names appear in Schedule 1.
 - c) "MA" means Motorcycling Australia Limited;
 - d) "State Controlling Body" (SCB) means a state or territory motorcycling association affiliated as a member of MA;
 - e) "Motorcycling Activities" means performing or participating in any capacity in any authorised or recognised Motorcycling Organisation event, meeting or activity;
 - f) "Motorcycling Organisation" means and includes MA, and the MA members (including the SCBs and affiliated clubs) and where the context so permits, their respective directors, officers, members, servants or agents.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISKS, DANGERS & OBLIGATIONS

3. I ACKNOWLEDGE that:
 - a) motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport (whether as a competitor, recreational rider, coach, official or media) at the Meeting I take and am exposed to certain risks and dangers and am under certain obligations as follows:
 - i) that I may be injured, physically or mentally, and may be killed;
 - ii) that my machinery or equipment may be damaged, lost or destroyed;
 - iii) that competitors may ride dangerously or with a lack of skill;
 - iv) that track or event conditions may be hazardous and may vary without warning or predictability;
 - v) that organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings are frequently obliged to make decisions under pressure of time/or events;
 - vi) that any policy of insurance of or in respect of my life or physical or mental health may be voided;
 - vii) that there may be no or inadequate facilities for treatment or transport of me if I am injured;
 - viii) that I have an obligation to myself and to others to act safely and within the rules and regulations of MA;
 - b) the Indemnitees do not make any warranty that the services at the Meeting will be provided with due care and skill or that any materials provided in connection with the services will be fit for the purpose for which they are supplied;
 - c) to the extent that any warranty is implied it is excluded to the full extent permitted by law;
 - d) have voluntarily read and understood this warning and accept and assume the inherent risks in participating in the Event.

WARNING UNDER THE FAIR TRADING ACT 1999 (VIC)

4. Under the provisions of the Fair Trading Act 1999 (Vic) several conditions are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. These conditions mean that the supplier named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you are:
 - rendered with due care and skill;
 - as fit for the purpose for which they are commonly bought as it is reasonable to expect in the circumstances; and
 - reasonably fit for any particular purpose or might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.

Under section 32N of the Fair Trading Act 1999, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree that these conditions do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to sue the supplier under the Fair Trading Act 1999 if you are killed or injured because the services were not rendered with due care and skill or they were not reasonably fit for their purpose, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.

NOTE: The change to your rights, as set out in this form, does not apply if your death or injury is due to gross negligence on the supplier's part. "Gross negligence" is defined in the Fair Trading (Recreational Services) Regulations 2004.

For the purposes of the clause 3, "the Supplier" shall mean and include the Indemnitees.

INDEMNITY AND RELEASE GIVEN TO ORGANISERS

5. IN CONSIDERATION of the acceptance of me as a participant in the Meeting:

- a) I AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND KEEP INDEMNIFIED to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them in the following manner:
 - i) that I participate in the meeting at my sole risk and responsibility;
 - ii) that I accept the Venue as it stands with all or any defects hidden or exposed;
 - iii) that I indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnitees, their respective servants, agents, officials and competitors against any actions, costs, losses or claims which may be made by me or on my behalf for or in respect of or arising out of my death or any injury loss or damage caused to me or my equipment whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other manner whatsoever.
- b) I AGREE TO RELEASE to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them from all liability to me for any claim, loss, damage, cost or expense (whether arising under statute, from negligence, personal injury, psychological trauma, death, property damage or infringement of third party rights or otherwise) that arises as a result of any act, matter or thing done, permitted or omitted to be done by me or which is in any way connected with my presence at or involvement in the Event.
6. The release and indemnity provided by me in this declaration is in addition to, and will not in any way limit the application of, the conditions of sale attaching to tickets, conditions of entry, conditions of credentials or any other applicable terms or conditions in respect of the Event.
7. A term of this release and indemnity will not apply where the term contravenes the law of the relevant jurisdiction under which any legal action is legitimately taken however such terms are severable and do not invalidate the remaining terms.

MEDICAL

8. I declare that I am and must continue to be medically and physically fit and able to participate in the Meeting. I will immediately notify MA in writing via my SCB of any change to my fitness and ability to participate. I understand and accept the Indemnitees will continue to rely upon this declaration as evidence of my fitness and ability to participate.
9. I acknowledge and agree that if required, the Indemnitees (or any of them) may arrange medical or hospital treatment (including ambulance transportation) for me. I authorise such actions being taken by the Indemnitees and agree to meet all costs associated with such action. I understand it is compulsory for me to have ambulance insurance in some form and I accept responsibility for the cost of ambulance transportation, ambulance cover and further agree to maintain ambulance cover during the term of my license / membership.

PRIVACY

10. I hereby consent to the collection of my personal information by the Promoter/Event Organiser, MA and the SCB in connection with my involvement at the Event and the use and disclosure of my personal information by the Promoter, and MA to other agencies and officials associated with the Event for the purposes of conducting and managing the Event. I understand that I may gain access to my personal information held by the Promoter/Event Organiser by contacting MA at 147 Montague St, South Melbourne, Victoria, 3205. I understand that if I do not provide the personal information requested above that I may not be permitted to participate in the Event.

PERSONAL HEALTH INFORMATION

11. I hereby agree with MA and the SCB that in consideration for my participation in the Event that MA and the SCB may receive, collect, store and use personal health information about me in the manner set out below:

- a) **I ACKNOWLEDGE that:**
 - i) If I am injured, become ill or die at or following the Event the party listed at Item 8 in Schedule 1 in addition to any hospital at which I am treated (together "my Carers") will have health related information about me in their possession, power and control relating to me which is subject to obligations imposed by the Privacy Act ("my Information") and the Privacy Act is intended to protect my personal information;
 - ii) MA and my SCB wish to collect my Information for purposes that include their risk management programs, evaluating and improving the safety of MA and SCB events and of the Meeting organisers and facility providers of MA / SCB permitted events, and generally to reduce the risks to persons engaged in motorcycle sport; and
 - iii) It is reasonable for MA and my SCB to collect, store, use and disclose my Information in accordance with clause 11(a)(i) above and in the manner set out in clause 11(b).
- b) **IN CONSIDERATION** of my acceptance as an entrant in the Meeting I consent and agree that MA and my SCB:
 - i) may collect and store any of my Information, including obtain my Information from third parties including my Carers;
 - ii) may use any information collected in accordance with this clause for any purpose consistent with creating safer competition in motorcycle sport and events held by or in conjunction with MA, my SCB, or with an MA or SCB permit;
 - iii) may disclose my Information to third parties provided such disclosure is reasonably intended to be used for the purpose of improving safety at events held by or in conjunction with MA, or with an MA permit provided any such information is held by MA or my SCB in accordance with the MA Privacy Policy.
